

ORDINANCE NO 114

**ORDINANCE OF ACADEMIC DRESS
AMENDMENT ORDINANCE**

The Council of the University of Tasmania makes this Ordinance under the University of Tasmania Act 1992.

1 Commencement

1.1 This ordinance takes effect on 2 July 2005.

1.2 This ordinance amends Ordinance 33 (Ordinance of Academic Dress) made by Council on 18 March 1994, to provide for academic dress for professional doctorates.

2 Professional Doctorates

2.1 Omit clause 1(ea), and substitute:

(ea) For professional doctorates:

- (i) a festal gown of black cloth, fully lined in the sleeves and faced on the full length of the lapels to a width of 10 centimetres with coloured silk;
- (ii) a black velvet bonnet trimmed with a coloured cord and tassel;
- (iii) a hood of coloured cloth of the same shape and size as that worn by Masters of Arts in the University of Oxford, lined with coloured silk;
- (iv) The colour of the silk, cord and tassel and hood is the relevant colour specified in Schedule 1.

2.2 In clause 1(g), omit the reference to ‘doctors of education’ and substitute ‘professional doctorates’.
